The VPN solution can be similarly buggy—you'll need to pay for a subscription to a service that allows you to monkey with your phone or computer's advanced settings in order for it to work, and some betting sites have additional protections to make it harder to wager from states that don't allow gambling, even if your VPN says you're in Indiana or New Mexico. So although it's certainly possible for Texans to bet on sporting events, the process comes with a lot of friction.

The silver lining for proponents of sports wagering is that the enacting legislation to create a legal framework for betting, should the constitution be amended to allow it, also passed the House yesterday, which means the law could go into effect quickly if the constitutional amendment survives the next steps. The outcome of yesterday's vote came as something of a surprise; the powerful House Freedom Caucus had signaled its opposition earlier in the session, issuing a tweet that declared sports betting "corporate welfare at its worst" and a giveaway to "woke" sports leagues. That's a fairly confusing hodgepodge of arguments—the largest gambling business in the United States, Las Vegas Sands Corporation, has 69 registered lobbyists in Texas, and is owned by the GOP megadonor Adelson family.
