A s Tax Day 2018 approaches, it is worth exploring a pressing question that is widely misunderstood: do undocumented immigrants pay federal taxes? Why Would an Undocumented Immigrant Pay Taxes? Only certain non-citizens are eligible to receive a Social Security number. If a n immigrant is authorized to work temporarily-whether through a work visa like a n H1-B or a temporary work-authorized status such as Deferred Action for Childho od Arrivals (DACA) or Temporary Protected Status-a Social Security number is iss ued and remains valid for the length of the work authorization period. Green car d holders, refugees, asylees, and certain other non-citizens who are allowed the live and work in the United States indefinitely are also eligible for a Social Security number with no restrictions. Undocumented immigrants are not eligible t o obtain a Social Security number. Since the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, all employers are required to verify the work eligibility of all new hires by completing Form I-9, which m andates the employee provide a Social Security number and show documents to their r employer to prove work authorization and identity. U.S. citizens frequently sh ow their driver \$\#39\$; s license and Social Security card, but because there are a number of documents that can be used to complete the form, the worker does not n ecessarily need to show their actual Social Security card. Undocumented workers who are hired without valid work authorization may provide their employer a fake Social Security number, someone else's number, or even a previously-valid n umber issued when they may have had work authorization that has since lapsed. Fu rthermore, most employers do not-and, except for certain employers, are not req uired to-verify this information with any government entity at the time of hire. Additionally, employers cannot, by law, ask to see any specific or additional d ocuments other than what the worker provides, so the Social Security number prov ided by an undocumented immigrant on their Form I-9 would be used by the employe r to withhold payroll taxes and would be included on their W-2 form. Further, the IRS will not allow a tax return to be filed with a fake or stolen S ocial Security number. Therefore, unauthorized workers who wish to file their ta and potentially get future credit for it- must find another way. Thus, many use the Individual Taxpayer Identification Number, or ITIN, which allows immigra nts without Social Security numbers to legally file tax returns and claim the in come reported on their W-2's to the IRS. What is an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN)? All that is required to obtain an ITIN is an application form that requires basi c information such as one's name, date of birth, and address, along with a f

illed-in federal income tax return, and proof of identity- not proof of work aut
